



City of SeaTac Prepared for Friday Winter Storm

SeaTac, WA (February 8, 2019) – Due to the Friday afternoon winter storm, City Manager Carl Cole closed City Hall and the Community Center at 1:30 PM to keep employees and visitors safe.

The Community Center will remain closed on Saturday and Sunday.

In preparation for today's snow event, Public Works and Parks maintenance staff employees cleared all primary arterial street routes in the City of snow and ice. All neighborhood roads have been cleared by plows and a brine solution has been sprayed on priority snow routes, steep hills and residential streets in preparation for today's snowfall.

Staff continue to plow and apply sand, salt and brine to primary arterial roadways within the City. For a list of snow plowing priority and road closures, [click here](#). For a map of snow plowing priority and road closures, [click here](#). Maintenance crews have moved to 12-hour, round-the-clock shifts to ensure the roadways are as clear as possible.

Residents are being urged to stay home unless absolutely necessary to travel on City streets. If you must drive, slow down, significantly increase your following distance and assume the roadway is icy. Also, allow for extra time to travel to your destinations.
