



## Registration Begins for New Parking Permit Program

**SeaTac, WA (March 26, 2019)** –The City of SeaTac is launching a brand new Parking Permit Program in the McMicken Heights Neighborhood of the City. Starting Monday, March 25, 2019, residents began registering their cars with the City. Each resident is allowed two permits per household. The first permit is free and the second permit costs \$65.

The program will help manage parking in congested neighborhoods. Resident feedback regarding a lack of parking on their streets near the Sea-Tac International Airport led to the Parking Permit program's development. To see a map of the parking zone visit

Residents or business owners who want to park for longer than three hours in the parking zone are required to register their vehicles. Residents can register their cars online or in person at City Hall. To learn more about the program and the permit requirements, please visit

Violators of the parking zone face a \$50 fine for parking longer than three hours. A violator can receive multiple tickets in one day. Vehicles parked in the permit parking zone longer than six hours may be subject to additional fines.

The permit parking program does not alter current applicable SeaTac parking laws. This includes a provision that vehicles must be moved every 24 hours.

Officers will begin enforcing the Parking Zones on May 1, 2019.

*Incorporated in February 1990, the City of SeaTac is located approximately midway between the cities of Seattle and Tacoma. The City of SeaTac is 10 square miles in area and has a population of 29,130\*. The City is a vibrant community, economically strong, environmentally sensitive, and people-oriented.
