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| <b>Presentations:</b><br>DAWN-Prevention<br>Kelly Rogers | <p>DAWN prevention has a new location in downtown Kent. They have recently started a Mobile Advocacy Service where the advocates can go to where the client is located. This has been very successful in continuing case management and helping victims get back on their feet. The City of Covington has partnered with DAWN, allowing them to have office space at the Covington Police Department for interviews and follow up reports. This helps with all wrap around services related to domestic violence. Highline School District has also partnered with DAWN bringing education and awareness to the high school level. Classes will begin in April and continue through September of 2019.</p> <p>Some of the programs they offer are:<br/>Law Assistance, mental health services, crisis intervention, children's DV response team, immigration services, survivor of abuse meetings along with shelter and advocacy.</p> <p>They have one shelter in Kent which holds up to 13 families.<br/>Amazon and Uber have donated several products and free Uber rides to those in need.</p> |
